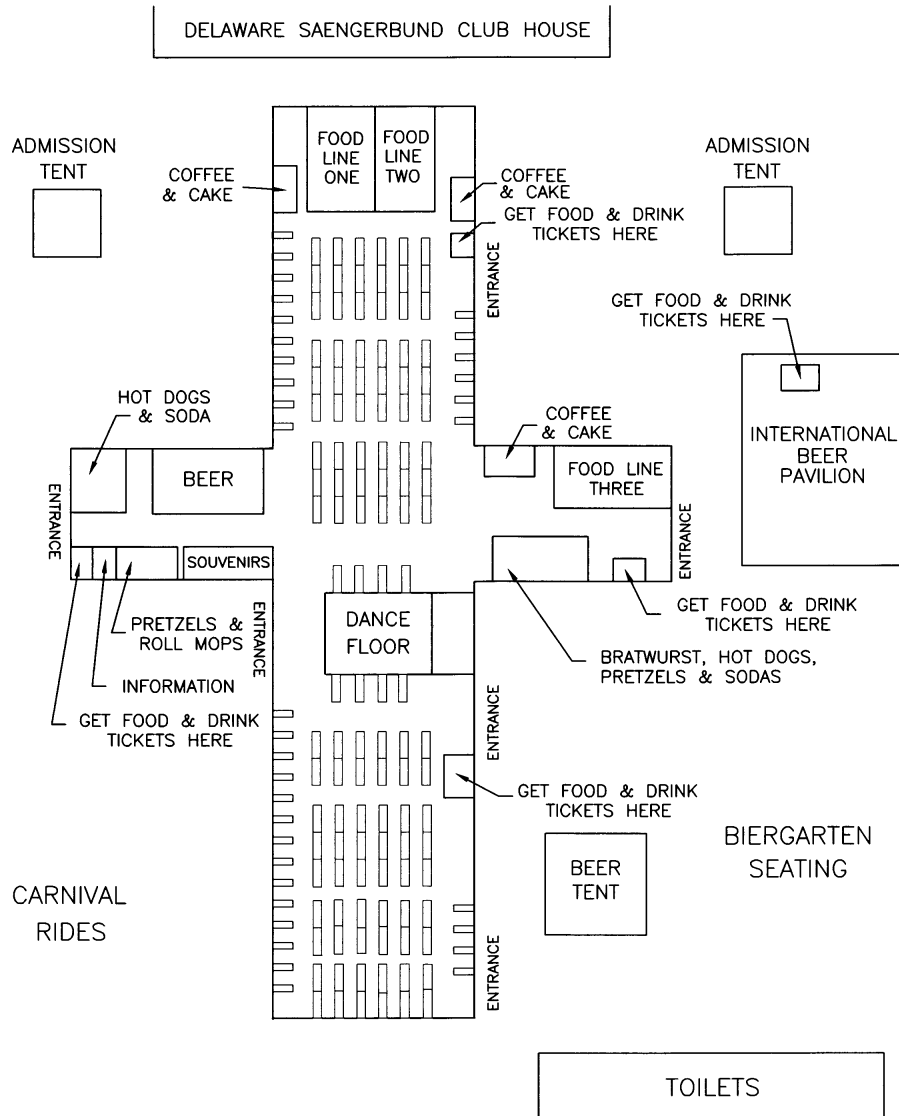

Purchase tickets BEFORE getting into Food or Beverage Lines.

Check signs at food lines for availability, as some items may vary, and check the express line for hot dogs or brats!

The Roast Pig Platter is available ONLY on Food Line One on Saturday and Sunday afternoon until the pig is gone, so come early!

Draft beer is available in the Main Tent, a large selection of bottled beers is available in the International Pavilion, and the Twin Lakes Brewery will be serving a special selection of brews in the Biergärten area. Bars close at 10:00 pm on Saturday and Sunday night.

Recycling containers are available for cans, plastic cups and bottles.

New this year are half-liter and liter "boots" commemorating thirty years of Oktoberfest under the tent at the Delaware Saengerbund.

No alcohol is permitted to leave the premises – so please empty your cups and glasses before you leave.
