**Spring Snowflake** (*Leucojum vernum*) are bulbous plants belonging to the Amaryllidaceae family.



The snowflakes are native to central and southern Europe, from the Pyrenées to Romania and western Russia, but they have been introduced and have naturalized in many other areas, including the east coast of North America. They have narrow, strap-like, dark green leaves. The flowers are small and bell-shaped, white with a green or occasionally yellow spot at the end of each tepal. They have a slight fragrance. Snowflakes normally grow 15-20 cm tall (6-8 in), though it may reach up to 35 cm (14 in). It flowers from mid-February to March, as soon as the snow melts in its wild habitat.

#### FROM THE BAUERNSTUBE

As the harsh winter starts to fade from memory, and the green grass and leaves return, so too do the seasonal lighter beers to the Bauernstube. While the darker, heavier beers are perfect for cold weather enjoyment, golden pilsners and light lagers tend to refresh the thirst when the temperature begins to rise. Some of our new lighter selections include Czechvar, a golden straw colored pilsner with a crisp dry finish. Löwenbräu or "Lion's Brew" has reportedly been brewed since 1383, Interestingly, it has been served at every Munich Oktoberfest since 1810 and is one of only six breweries permitted to serve beer there. When the golden and clean lagers of Plzen (Bohemia) became all the rage in the mid-1800's, München brewers feared that Germans would start drinking the Czech beer vs. their own. Munich Helles Lager was their answer. Maybe you prefer a draft instead? For the month of March our draft beer will be a local brew from Fordhams brewery, Queen Anne's Kölsch. A well made beer with very light sweet pilsner type malts upfront and then a clean and refreshing effervescence over your tongue in mid-sip. If you'd prefer something in wine, Ménage à Trois red is back in stock. A combination of three reds, it's smooth, just the right amount of sweet and not overly dry. Of course none of these taste as good unless you are sitting with good friends in the comfort of the Bauernstube.

March 17th the Bauernstube goes green for a day! Opening at 11 am, We'll have Guinness and Harp specials, Black and Tans and Belfast car bombs. Beginning around 2pm, we'll have an Irish buffet from Bette to include Sailor's beef, Ham and cabbage, Colcanon, Guinness cake with whipped Irish Creme. I hear that Dennis will be making Potato Soup and we may be seeing some of Paula Ledwith's Brown Bread. Flyers will be posted with more information.

The Homebrewers continue to meet every third Monday of the month in the Von Stueben Zimmer at 7:30 pm. Last month, we brewed our second batch of beer already, and, we even went all grain. All DSB members are welcome to attend any meeting or brew session. Stop out and catch the homebrewing bug.
