DSB Germany Trip ended on 9/8/13

Twenty-two travelers explored the following German cities and Prague in the Czech Republic for 14 days.

Hamburg – has more waterways than Venice, Paris, or St. Petersburg put together. An evening boat cruise proved that.

Lübeck – a mid-century town that retains so much of its grandeur surrounded by canals and crowned by belfries and towers.

Berlin – full of memories, many sad, especially remains of the wall. We had Alex, our city guide; take us to most famous places in this Weltstadt.

Meissen – since the 1700's the center for fine porcelain. Saw live demonstrations of the skillful artists who create these treasures.

Dresden – walking tour of the rebuilt Frauenkirche and Fürstenzug (Processions of the Dukes) which survived the fire storm, it consists of 24,000 Meissen tiles that are 3,140 feet long.

Seiffen – the town people survived by making wooden toys after the silver mines petered out.

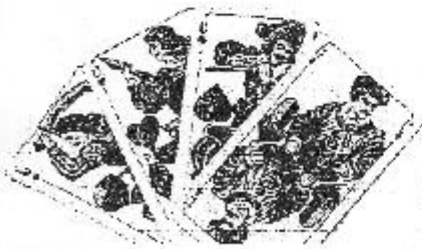
