A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PRESIDENT

Liebe Mitglieder - Dear Members,

According to our Constitution it is my job each year, to advise the General Membership the state of the Delaware Saengerbund.

Once again we are financially sound, due to another successful Oktoberfest.

Projects completed in 2013 are:

1. Computerized registers were installed in the Deutsche Halle Bar to give us a full loop between the Bauernstube and Halle allowing us to analyze costs and usage as well as keep better inventory records.
2. We entered the State of Delaware Lottery for solar installation on our facility allowing us to become part of the renewable energy process. We were chosen and work has been started on the installation, end result will be a \$48,000 reimbursement from the State of Delaware Green Energy Fund when the project is completed.
3. Parking lot lighting problems have been resolved with the installation of timers on all parking lot lights.
4. Permanent fencing was installed near the back sheds to secure the Oktoberfest perimeter which had been a huge problem in the past.

Improvements on the docket for 2014 include:

1. Security system being researched to protect our facility and assets.
2. New lighting to be investigated for the Deutsche Halle due to obsolescence of current equipment and high energy usage.
3. General maintenance and upgrades to the building as items are becoming old and need to be replaced.
4. Pursue acquisition of available property surrounding the DSB for future needs.

Finance Committee - Standing Committee:

They have worked hard this year, continuing with the development of SOP's for the Bauernstube and general facility which are a matter of record. These procedures are slowly being put in place, helping us create better accountability and finance records.

Lastly - I would like to thank all of you who have volunteered to help when we have asked, and for those of you that have not done so, make a New Year's Resolution to help in 2014. This is your

From the Bauernstube

Gemütlichkeit - means a situation that induces a cheerful mood, peace of mind, with the connotation of belonging and social acceptance, coziness and unhurry.

Gemütlichkeit derives from *gemütlich*, the adjective of *Gemüt*, which means "heart, mind, temper, feeling". The current meaning of the word derives from its use in the Biedermeier period. By the second half of the 19th century, it also became associated with a set of traits supposedly unique to Germans and German culture. In the United States, the city of Jefferson Wisconsin uses the phrase: "*The Gemütlichkeit City*" as its motto.

The song "The Bare Necessities" from Disney's "The Jungle Book" (1967), where a cheerful Baloo explains how "a bear can rest at ease with just the bare necessities of life" was rendered as *Probier's mal mit Gemütlichkeit* ("consider trying *Gemütlichkeit*") in the German version.

In the 1973 English contract law case *Jarvis v Swans Tours Ltd*, a holidaymaker sued after not receiving the *Gemütlichkeit* promised by the promotional literature for a package holiday to the Swiss Alps.

One of my duties as 1st VP is to continue to foster the feeling of *Gemütlichkeit* in the Bauernstube. With your help, it will grow and continue to thrive for many more generations. I look forward to seeing you and your families as we keep the fine traditions alive and well.

Heimatkunde Berühmte Namen der Heimat(Famous names from the homeland)

Technik - Robert Bosch, 1861 - 1942. Ein gelernter Feinmechaniker, aus der Gegend von Ulm, der sich später auf die Entwicklung von elektro - mechanischen Geräte spezialisierte. Seine erfolgreichen Erfindungen sowie seine kaufmännischen Kenntnisse führten zu einem weltweiten Konzern, bekannt unter den Firmen Namen " Bosch Dienst - Bosch Service."

(A well versed mechanic from the area of Ulm who later specialized in the development of electro-mechanical devices. His successful inventions as well as his business experience led to his world-wide business firm under the well know name of "Bosch Service").

Dichter - Johann Wolfgang von Goethe 1749 (Frankfurt) - -1832 (Weimar) Nicht nur war Goethe ein Dichter, er befasste sich auch mit verschiedenen naturwissenschaftlichen Gebieten und beschäftigte sich auch mit politischen Situationen. Sein Vater war Jurist und finanziel gut gestellt. Schon früh kam der junge Goethe in Kontakt mit Literatur. Es begann mit den Gutenachtgeschichten der Mutter und mit der Bibellektuere der lutherisch - protestantischen Familie. Goethes Werke bestanden aus Märchen Gedichte, Lieder und dogmatischen Schriften.

(Not only was Goethe a poet, he concerned himself with various scientific areas as well as political involvement. His father was a lawyer and financially well off. Already at a young age Goethe came in contact with good-night stories of his mother and with the Lutheran Bible stories of is family. His works consist of fairy tale stories, songs and opinion writings.)
