A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PRESIDENT

Liebe Mitglieder - Dear Members,

As most of you know, the Delaware Saengerbund is a tax exempt club namely a 501 (C) (4) organization. There are many types of 501 (C) organizations – the “501” designation is simply the

IRS non-profit “umbrella”. Under the 501 designation there are (29) types of non-profit organizations, every one of the 29 designations have different criteria and guidelines to follow to ensure they maintain their non-profit status. According to the Internal Revenue a 501 (C) (4) organization is classified as a Social Welfare organization that has as their primary purpose engaging in social welfare activities, must be not organized for profit and must be operated exclusively to promote social welfare – our net earnings devoted exclusively to charitable, educational and recreational purposes, primarily operating exclusively for promoting the common good and general welfare of the people of the community.

We have done very little community out-reach and essentially the hall has been offered only for organizations that DSB members or close relations are involved in, namely the Cancer Society, Boy Scouts and a group of Shriners that raise money for transportation of families for children suffering from cancer.

For audit purposes, we need to do much more of this kind of activity for our records. If you personally don't approve, you are more than welcome to your opinion but as the Board of Directors we need to make decisions that follow the protocol established for the Delaware Saengerbund and our IRS non-profit status. If you should have questions, please come to the people that make the decisions and ask why. The Board of Directors decisions are based on what is best for the DSB and the membership as a whole, following the guidelines according to the Internal Revenue Code.

A talk titled "Through the Eyes of Tourists: Germany as WWI Commences" is being offered by Dr. Joseph Neville in conjunction with the DE Historical Society on September 11th, 2014 at 6:30 p.m. at the Delaware Historical Society Library & Archives, 505 N.
