The DSB reserves the right to deny access or membership to any person who has been accused or convicted of any crime involving sexual abuse, is or has been a registered sex offender, has ever been convicted of any offense relating to the use, sale, possession or transportation of narcotics or dangerous drugs.

In the rare instance that someone's behavior threatens you, or you observe inappropriate behavior, please contact the DSB Board of Directors immediately.
