Weihnachten Tatsachen (Christmas Facts)

Remember Weihnachten in the Old Country ? There was no chubby Santa coming down the chimney on Xmas day or the night before. However this special season often started in a serious manner for youngsters between ages 6 to 12 in early December, Saint Nicholas, a bishop in early times, is celebrated on 6th. December. The night before boys and girls are visited by the good Nicholas and his assistant the bad Krampus. While Saint Nicholas often would be dressed in flowing white and red robes, Krampus is an ugly dirty creature with a sack of coal or potatoes, a chain and several switches. Saint Nicholas knows all about the good and bad deeds of the children i.e. " did you eat all your dinner, did you help your parents, did you complete your homework,?" and if not, then Krampus may take you away or use the switch. In the end there are always gifts of fruit, candy or small toys; but not before reciting a prayer or a song. Also most of the time a switch was left with the parents, just in case.

Christmas Eve and Christmas Day are the happiest times in all the holiday season when children of all ages await the Christkind{!} or Christ Child and the sharing of gifts. Christmas itself is a two day affair. At noon on Christmas Eve most activities, shops close, public transportation is reduced the streets become quiet and empty even in large cities. The family prepares for a special dinner , often consisting of fish, while the Christkind's helpers are busy with the finishing touches in the closed off family room. After supper they listen for the tinkling of a little bell announcing that the Christkind has finished fixing the Christmas tree. The locked door of the living room opens and all enter.to admire the ornaments on the fully lighted (often with real candles) tree and the presents underneath. Before the presents are opened the family sings together Stille Nacht and other favorite carols. Midnight services are still popular in the country side. Christmas Day dinner often includes roast goose stuffed with chestnuts and apples The meal is topped off with all kinds of special cakes. Not to forget the mandatory Christmas Drink offered to neighbors and shared with friends and family.
